Board Member Conflict of Interest

No School Board member shall have a beneficial interest directly or indirectly in any contract, work, or business of the District unless permitted by The School Code and the Corrupt Practices Act.

School Board members must annually file a "Statement of Economic Interests" as required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. Each School Board member is responsible for filing the statement with the county clerk of the county in which the District's principal office is located by May 1.

No School Board member shall solicit or accept a gift that he or she has reason to believe is offered in an effort to influence his or her official position. The Board policy 5:130, *Limitations on Accepting Gifts*, applies to Board members. In addition to other examples of acceptable gifts, that policy allows Board members to receive from one source during any calendar year items having a cumulative value of less than \$100.
